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

Our learning this week:

<u>Maths:</u> We have been learning how to subtract using the column method with regrouping and renaming (parents might know this as 'borrowing').

## **Spelling Rules and Handwriting**

This week we have been practising writing this spelling rule: adding suffixes beginning with a vowel (-er,-ed,-ing) to words with more than one syllable. When the last syllable is stressed you need to double the final consonant before adding the suffix.
