Pupil Premium Report 2014/15

The Pupil Premium is an additional sum of money allocated to schools with pupils who are recorded as being eligible for Free School meals (FSM) in the last 6 years, who are Looked After or who have a parent serving in the Armed Forces. Schools have the freedom to spend the Pupil Premium in a way they think will best support the raising of attainment for their most vulnerable pupils.

St Augustine's has received the following amount of Pupil Premium funding:

2011/12 - £12,872

2012/13 - £20,100

2013/14 - £37,095

2014/15 - £58,204

This year, money has been prioritised for:

- Early identification and intervention in the core subjects. (Maths and English)
- Support from teachers and teaching assistants for those children who are making slow progress in Maths and English.
- Creating 2 smaller classes for Maths and English for the year group with a high proportion of disadvantaged pupils.
- Purchasing proven effective resources.
- Provide extra small group and individual tuition during and before/ after school to help narrow the gap in children's learning.
- Assisting in the cost of music tuition and educational visits.
- Supporting emotional needs through ELSA input.

Pupil Achievement – Summer 2015

The following data shows the impact of this extra provision for disadvantaged children.

In the Year 1 Phonics Screening, 100% of disadvantaged pupils (5) achieved the standard compared to 66% nationally.

By the end of KS1, the percentage of disadvantaged pupils compared with similar pupils nationally is shown below.

Pupil Premium 2015/16

Our school allocation for 2015/16 is £47, 520. Priorities for the use of this funding are:

- Improving confidence and basic skills in maths.
- Supporting higher quality writing in KS2.
- Continuing to provide 1:1 and small group interventions and boosters
- Purchasing good quality resources
- Staff training and development
