You may be aware the Department for Education has attendance as a current focus. Their aim is to bring attendance levels back to pre-pandemic levels. As part of this, we will be writing to the parents of children in the New Year who have attendance levels below 90%. This is classed by the Department of Education as being persistently absent.
