This week our gospel reading was linked to listening to Jesus and following His words.


Our Gospel Value has been integrity and it's been a joy to see the way that the children have worked hard throughout the week to achieve their best.

News from across the school

Reception	Reception have had a lovely week getting to know each other now that the whole class are in. It has been lovely to see new friendships forming across the week. In Maths this week, we have been making sure we are confident with counting to 5 and finding one more and one less than a number up to 5. In understanding the world, we have been using natural materials that we found whilst hunting around outside to make story sticks. We have also been exploring using arrows in maps and have made maps in different ways such as duplo maps and drawn maps. The children have also learnt more sounds in phonics this week and are really impressing us with their handwriting!
Year 1	It's been another busy week in Year 1. The children have been learning about parts of a tree in Science and have been learning about what each part does. In RE we've continued to learn about Creation. The children have taken photos of God's creation and have also been learning the first part of the Nicene Creed as they've learned about God the Creator. Here's a piece of work from one of our amazing children.

	In History the children have been learning about the differences between old and new toys. We've been impressed with the way they have shared their understanding of why certain materials are used to make toys. We've also had fun learning to say hello in 10 different languages this week.
Year 2	Year 2 have been fantastic artists and have now completed their first piece of artwork in the same style as our significant artist, Lowry. We have started the Maths '99 club' and we look forward to being able to give out some certificates in the coming weeks for children who progress to the next level. In English, the children have written some thoughtful poems about our Wonderful World which has also enriched our learning in R.E. about God's creation. It was lovely to see those of you who were able to make, 'Meet the Teacher'. As always, if you have any questions, we are on the door at the end of the day, so please just ask.
Year 3	What a wonderful week we have had in Year 3 this week. The children are working incredibly hard and we are very proud of them. In English this week we have started to use the text Cave Baby to write some description and have also done some hot seating which the children thoroughly enjoyed. In Maths the children have continued their learning on 3-digit numbers and have been looking at estimating numbers on a number line. In Science, we have been learning how light travels into our eyes. The children are really enjoying their learning in History. This week the children looked at what life would have been like in the Stone Age and explored artefacts. In RE this week we have been learning about Psalmists. We have focused on King David who wrote many beautiful Psalms. Thank you for a lovely week of learning!
Year 4	Another busy week in Year 4 and I think the children are now starting to settle into our routine. In Maths this week, we have been thinking about place value in 4-digit numbers and how to partition them. In English, we have continued planning our stories that we will write next week. In RE, we have continued to think about Abraham's story and why he is important in Judaism, Christianity and Islam. The children

	produced some lovely Ancient Egyptian collages in our art lesson this week. We were very lucky to have our first Samba music session with Mr Whitmarsh too, the children all engaged wonderfully in this session and we're looking forward to seeing Mr Whitmarsh every Wednesday until the end of November.
Year 5	Year 5 have been working hard all week and we've covered a great deal of ground. In Maths we have been ordering and comparing numbers to 1 000 000. The children have amazed us with their diary writing, where they had to imagine themselves as the main protagonist and elucidate all the thoughts and feelings that a child about to undergo a major operation would face. We have looked (with real gusto) at crime and punishment in the period 1500 – 1750, identified and examined what information on the internet can be trusted and in RE have continued to explore the God-given gifts and talents that we all possess and then linked this to Scripture.
Year 6	We have continued to work hard in Year 6 this week. In our writing, the children produced some great short stories, encompassing a number of the skills that we have looked at recently, including the rules of speech. Our Maths is continuing to develop, with the class managing to understand several new concepts, including an efficient method to tackle double digit division. The book that we are looking at in Reading, 'Darwin's Dragons', is starting to gather pace, as we discuss different theories of what will happen to Syms. In R.E, we have considered, in more depth, the story and impact of The Prodigal Son, while we looked at codes and the importance of passwords in computing.
