

Our Catholic Virtues

We are very happy to be launching the Catholic Virtues at school with our children.

As the Catechism says...

“A virtue is an habitual and firm disposition to do good. It allows the person not only to perform good acts, but to give the best of himself.

The goal of a virtuous life is to become more like God.”

We are introducing each virtue in turn to fully embed the children’s understanding and every month we focus on one virtue, launching it during Liturgy and then asking the children to show this virtue in action as they go about their daily lives.

This term we are focusing on the theological virtues of faith, hope and charity.

Faith

Faith is the ability to believe in God and to work for Him, in His Holy name.

Hope

Hope is the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness.

Charity

Charity is the theological virtue by which we love God and our neighbours as ourselves, for the Love of God.
