Pupil Premium Report 2013/14

The Pupil Premium is an additional sum of money allocated to schools with pupils who are recorded as being eligible for Free School meals (FSM) in the last 6 years, who are Looked After or who have a parent serving in the Armed Forces. Schools have the freedom to spend the Pupil Premium in a way they think will best support the raising of attainment for their most vulnerable pupils.

St Augustine's has received the following amount of Pupil Premium funding:

2011/12 - £12,872 2012/13 - £20,100 2013/14 - £37,095

This year, money has been prioritised for:

- ❖ Early identification and intervention in the core subjects. (Maths and English)
- Support from teachers and teaching assistants for those children who are making slow progress in Maths and English.
- Purchasing proven effective resources.
- Provide extra small group and individual tuition during and before/ after school to help narrow the gap in children's learning.
- Assisting in the cost of music tuition and educational visits.
- Supporting emotional needs through ELSA input.
- Raising attainment in KS2 Writing and Maths in order to achieve national expectations or higher.

Pupil Achievement – Summer 2014

The following data shows the impact of this extra provision for children on FSM. By the end of KS1, the <u>average point scores (APS)</u> for pupils in receipt of free school meals compared with similar children nationally is shown below. (see below)
