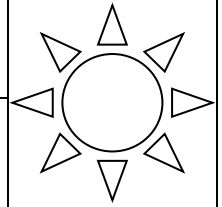

Spelling pattern for week beginning 06/09/2024

Week 1 - using cious to spell the long 'shuhs' sound

This sound can be spelt two ways. The first is cious and the second is tious. This week we are looking at

cious.

HANDY TIP - The cious ending is often used to make an adjective out of a noun. For instance, space is a thing (a noun) and spacious is the adjective. Notice: because the noun had a 'c' in it, the adjective uses the cious ending instead of the tious. This is a general rule to follow when using this sound.
