This week we have revisited division and looked at finding remainders as decimals. We have then discussed interpreting these remainders in the context of the question.

For example:

1) A prize of £6710.40 is shared amongst a class of 36 children. How much does each child get?

(This problem would require a decimal remainder, so the answer would be £186.40 rather than a remainder of £186 r 14) 2) A farmer collects 216 eggs from his chickens. He puts them into boxes of 6 to sell. How many full boxes does he have and how many eggs are left for him to eat? (213  $\div$  6 = 35.5 or 35 r 3 - this question would need a remainder as it asks how many whole eggs are left over or the farmer)

## <u>Task 1</u>

The children have a selection of word problems where they need to interpret the remainders and decide if they need a remainder or a decimal. As per usual they have chosen their challenge (\*, \*\* or \*\*\*).

They must decide whether the question needs a standard remainder or a decimal remainder depending on the context of the question.
