WOW! We had such a fabulous day on Tuesday. A special thank you to those parents who offered their time to come and help us. We are so proud of how the children behaved and represented the school. Farmer George, Jane and Penny were so complementary of the children and how well they behaved. We arrived at 10am and went into the barns to look at the different grains that had been harvested. We saw barley, wheat, millet, rapeseed and beans and we were able to hold them and find out how they are harvested and grown and what they are used for. Farmer George then loaded us onto his trailer that is pulled by a big tractor. He took us to his cow field and we went inside on the trailer. The cows were very keen to see us and very noisy! We learnt all about how cows eat and digest food and what the cows were used for. He then took us off to some of his crop fields and showed us what was growing there and what he planned to grow. We went in some wild flower fields and had a look at what was growing and also into the woods to see the plants in there. He then drove us back to the sheep field. We all got off the trailer and went into the sheep to feed them. The sheep were extremely friendly!! We fed them, felt their wool and enjoyed giving them a stroke! We then headed back to the classroom on the farmyard where we had some lunch and read the story of the Little Red Hen. We then learnt how the wheat is grinded to make flour and watched this process. Farmer George then showed us a machine that turned rapeseed into oil which was brilliant to see. After this, we split into groups to do a carousel of activities. Activity one was a cutting and sticking task to decide what things were grown on the farm and what was grown elsewhere. Activity 2 was kneading and shaping bread rolls using the flour we had grinded and finally the third activity was cutting, chopping and peeling vegetables for a soup! We then headed out to see the chickens whilst the soup cooked. Farmer George showed us some fresh eggs and we talked about the chickens and what they needed. Finally, we headed back into the classroom to eat soup and bread which was delicious!! We then loaded back onto the coach and headed back to school. A super busy but brilliant day!!!
