



Topic and Links to Subject Areas:

India

Literacy - Reading 'Cloud Tea Monkeys' - reading comprehension for term based on class text.

Literacy - descriptive writing based on tea plantations, persuasive letter writing to stop child labour on tea plantations and non-chronological report writing on fair trade products from India.

Geography - locating country in relation to oceans, equator, tropics and adjoining countries.

Comparing and contrasting locations within country.

Maths - fair trade money game - working out percentages and fractions of the final banana price that each member in the chain gets from plantation worker right through to supermarket owner.

Art/RE - Divali and Divali Rangoli patterns.

Sparkling Start:

Tea tasting - children to taste a selection of teas, rate them and write a short review for each one.
