We will also be learning about the seas and oceans If any parents have connections with these particular countries and are willing to come in to talk to the children, you would be most welcome, It has been lovely learning from parents who work in the Emergency/medical professions . We really value your involvement and we firmly believe the children learn so much from these visits.
