This week we have continues to work on practical addition, together with using dominoes for adding and for some children, we have introduced adding using a number track.

To continue to support your child with this work, we ask that you carry out the following activities.

#### Task 1

Using dominoes, please develop your child's counting and adding skills whilst also extending their use of mathematical vocabulary. Taking a domino from the box, ask your child how many spots are on one side. Then ask how many are on the other side. After this, to reinforce the concept of putting groups of objects together to add, ask your child how many spots there are altogether? Or ask how many there are in total?

#### Extension

If this is easy for your child, continue to use the number track above. As suggested last week, using a dice and rolling it twice to give 2 numbers to add together could be a useful practical activity, or alternatively, you could get them to generate their own addition sums starting with each number being in the 1-5 range perhaps and extending as appropriate. Making use of 'Paint the squares' could help too as you generate addition sums for your child to work on using the grid to 30 to help them. https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/paint-the-squares

#### <u>Handwriting</u>

We have continued to teach the children the entry stroke to our pre-cursive script and as you work with your child, please remind them to start from the 'baseline' and to go 'up the hill' every time they form an entry stroke.

This week our focus letter has been 'm'

Please work with your child on forming this letter and use the following vocabulary,

'Up the hill, down the short ladder, back up the short ladder, over the rainbow, down, back up, over the rainbow, down and flick.'

By using this language, you will reinforce our work at school and help your child form their letters.

Encourage your child to use a range of tools. If they find manipulating smaller tools difficult at this time, perhaps work with water and paintbrushes in the garden, or paint and paint brushes on large sheets of paper. Rainbow writing is also fun, so a range of colourful felt tips or colouring pencils could be used.
