Sports Day

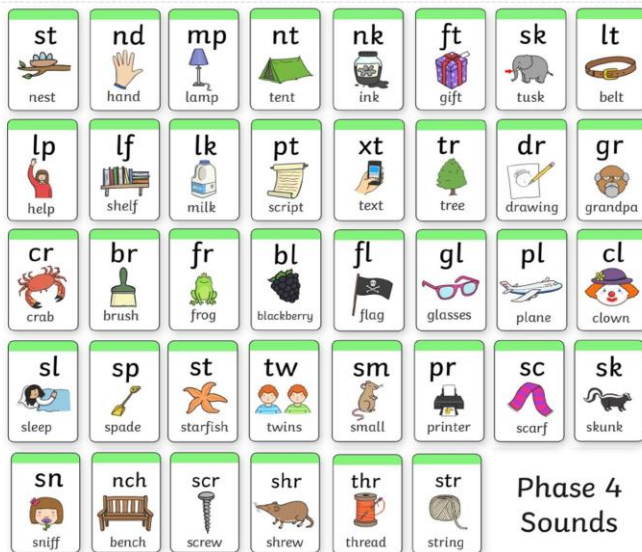

Phonics

We are now busy consolidating all the phonic sounds we have taught the children this term. We are still continuing to work on your child's key words. Please do take time to revisit the phonics we have taught during the year, together with the key words that we place in your child's reading record book. All this extra work on consolidation will help your child immensely when they move to Year 1.



Here is a list of all the Phase 4 sounds that do not feature your child's phonics books.

Maths work.

This week, we have continued to work on partitioning the numbers 6, 7 and 8.

Please continue with the activities suggested last week to help your child develop their understanding of number bonds.

These suggestions were to use the 'Numberblocks' songs and programmes on the Cbeebies website as a starting point and then working with your child on constructing a tower or rod of bricks, which they could then physically take apart to see that 2 parts make a whole. By focussing on ways of making 6, 7 and 8 you will help to reinforce the work done at school.

If your child copes well with this activity, you could extend them by helping them record their work pictorially and perhaps by constructing adding sums with them.

For example, $3+5=8$

$4+4=8$ etc...

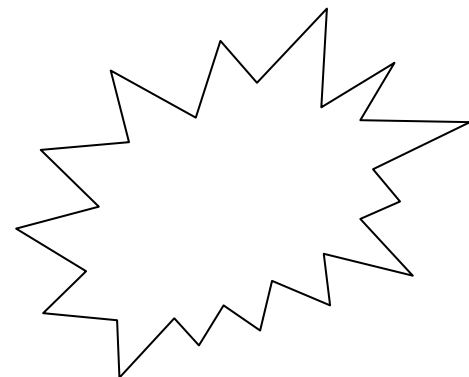
Helping your child see that numbers are made up of smaller parts will really help them when they go into Year 1.
