

RHE and PSHE

Next week in Relationships and Health Education, we'll be continuing to focus on Online Safety.

Through a story about Freddy Teddy learning to use a new device, this session will serve as an introduction to the internet and how we use it – in ways that can be both positive and negative.

Following on from learning about what the internet actually is, we'll introduce the children to some rules to help them stay safe whilst using the internet – especially whilst playing games.

<u>Reading</u>	<u>Times Table Rock Stars</u>	Spellings/Phonics
Please read at least 5x over the week. Please remember to write in their reading journals so we can count their reads. Remember that in their daily phonics lessons the children participate in reading activities.	Have fun working on counting in 10s and the 10 times table and on counting in 5s and the 5 times table. To help your child with the games online, when children are presented with 2X10 for example, you could ask your child to count in 10s, perhaps presenting them with 2 wooden blocks or drawing 2 long lines to represent 10. The children are very experienced in counting in 10s and also in 5s. Have fun.	The children who have purple RWI reading books have continued learning the Set 3 Sounds detailed below. Please revisit all Set 2 sounds and the Set 3 sounds
