

#### News from across the school

Reception	We have had a fantastic week getting to know the children in
	Reception and can't wait to continue getting to know them over the
	next few weeks. We have been so impressed with how well the
	children have settled into school life and have taken on changes and
	learnt new routines. We were particularly impressed with their tidying
	skills!! The children have enjoyed meeting new friends and exploring

	the classroom. They have drawn self-portraits and learnt the Creation story. We're looking forward to seeing you all again next week! Please note: your child will have brought home a book bag this week with a reading diary. This is for you to record each time your child reads with you at home. The reads are then counted each week and children can earn badges and certificates. They also brought home two books. These are books for them to enjoy with you – not phonics books – and they will be changed each week.
Year 1	What a fantastic start to the year. The children have settled into their new routines beautifully and have made an excellent start on their learning. They've started to learn about pace and rhythm in Music, have started to share the story of Goldilocks in English and in RE have been learning about the Creation story. It's been great fun!
Year 2	The children in Year 2 have returned to school full of enthusiasm for learning. Already we have seen many examples of children showing compassion to each other. We have enjoyed sharing the story, "The Green Ship" together and the children have impressed us with their maths skills.
Year 3	We have had a really lovely first week back! It has been wonderful getting to know the children and spending time with them. We have begun to look at the Stone Age in our History lessons which the children are really excited about. This week, the children have written a story using a picture stimulus. This is their first piece of writing for year 3 and something we will look back on in the months to come! In Maths, we have started getting our brains working again and practicing our tables as well as thinking about place value. We are really excited for the term and looking forward to all the learning that is to come!
Year 4	We have had a lovely start to Year 4 and it has been great getting to know your children. In Maths, we have spent some time revising and consolidating our known times tables from Year 3. Next week, we will begin looking at the Year 4 times tables. We have been looking at writing stories in English and we have been continuing to develop our understanding of cyberbullying in PSHE. Our History topic this term is the Ancient Egyptians and this will spread across several subject areas, we have already read the story of the Egyptian Cinderella in Whole Class Reading and we have looked at Ancient Egyptian paintings, sculpture and jewelry in Art.
Year 5	It has been very pleasing to see how enthusiastically and maturely the children have started Year 5. We have dived headlong into our exciting curriculum for this Autumn half term and the children have really enjoyed reading our class text 'Pig-Heart Boy'. We are beginning to learn about crime and punishment through the ages in our history

	lessons and in RE we have been identifying the talents and qualities that make us unique.
Year 6	We have had a wonderful and hardworking beginning to the year. The children have hit the ground running and shown, even in these few days, a superb work ethic. They have settled comfortably into the Year 6 routines and have enjoyed the start of their topics. It has been a stellar start, and I thoroughly look forward to the rest of the year.
