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The Exciting Writing Project

This involved a small group of six pupils comprising three from Year 4 and three from Year 5. The group featured Henry Price, Jaimee Browne and Daniel Mason from Year 5. From Year 4 there were Leon Michalak, Sam Booker and Iris Collin. A volunteer helper from St Augustine's Parish was facilitator for this small group.

The aim was to produce a collection of short stories. Each session opened with a group discussion. The first discussion centred on their current reading books.

The group agreed that they tended to choose reading books that interested them and that what they read influenced what they wrote. Some group members liked to choose information books and others enjoyed fiction. The group explored the idea of "faction" that tries to combine both.

The group members wanted to give their stories a feeling of reality by bringing in their own experiences or those of their family. The group aimed to focus not just on action but on emotions. Sam felt that tapping into his family's experiences helped him to write a convincing narrative.

Another discussion considered the role of location, characters, events and time in their stories. It was decided that for a short story there could be too many changes of location, too many named characters, too much happening and far too long a time period so that readers and listeners might become confused. Leon used two very contrasting locations in his story, while Iris and Daniel focused on one.

Lastly the group considered whether they should be narrators from outside telling the story or should they be actual characters inside the story.

Each group member then began the task of constructing a storyboard in which each frame moved the story forward like a cartoon. This also helped with the construction of paragraphs in the final write up as each frame inspired a new paragraph.

Like authors everywhere the group members found that they revised their stories both by adding and subtracting detail before submitting the final draft. Daniel and Sam found that typing their work on the computer helped.

Finally they read each other's work and tried to criticise the work constructively; destructive criticism is much easier to do! Their literary criticisms are to be found at the end of this collection of stories.

Each person decided which year group in the school might enjoy listening to their particular story. For such performance they agreed that they would need to speak clearly and tell their stories with expression and enthusiasm. They would need to avoid speaking too quickly. Sam read his story very successfully to his peers in Year 4.


Four out of the six original group members reached the extended publication deadline. These four were grateful for the input of the other two members in earlier discussion sessions.

The stray cat they kept and called it Jake. They agreed never to leave a window open again and to live a quiet life with no more adventures.


The author says:

On a blisteringly hot day Jack and Archie are in a hut in Hawaii. Suddenly, the nearby volcano erupts.


They are forced to evacuate the hut and leap into their strong wooden canoe, travelling to a nearby island.


