Our learning this week:

<u>Maths:</u> This week we have been continuing to learn about subtraction, and have been subtracting multiples of 100, 10 and 1 from three-digit numbers. For example: 794 – 3, 794 – 30 and 794 – 300.

<u>English</u>: This week we have been learning about non-chronological reports. We have looked at information books and have planned and written our own information books about Roman gladiators. You could help to support this learning at home by looking at information texts together and discussing some of the features (e.g. title, introduction, paragraphs, subheadings, glossary, pictures and diagrams). Can your child identify these features in an information text? Can they suggest some reasons why information texts usually include these features?

<u>RE:</u> In RE this week we have been learning about the rites of reconciliation.

<u>Science and Topic</u>: In Science we have been continuing our investigation of rocks and soil, in particular experimenting with permeability. In Topic we have created our own mosaics based on examples of original Roman mosaics. We have also been finding out about Roman numerals and it would be great if you could help your child to apply this at home by pointing out any examples of Roman numerals that you come across in daily life (e.g. house numbers, dates at the end of film credits, numbers around a clock face).
